Thanks also to our music instructors Julie Smith (who compered the evening) and to Beth Wyllie who accompanied many of the participants.



A number of pupils took part in the Angus Schools Cross Country event on Tuesday. All pupils did well in their races. Stand-out individual performances include Eddie Baxter who finished 2^{nd} in the s3 boys' event and Finn Graham who finished 2^{nd} overall in the senior boys' event. The S3 boys' team of Eddie Baxter, Heath Duncan, Charlie Kerr and Kyle Jessiman also finished 2^{nd} overall. Mr Hely and Mr McLachlan, who accompanied the group, said the pupils' behaviour throughout the whole event was 'amazing' and that they represented the school fantastically.

On a much less positive note, we continue to experience vandalism and misuse of the toilets. The following is now posted in pupil bulletin:

Toilets

Due to vandalism and serious misuse of the boys' toilets, we are only able to open them for certain periods of time. They will always be open and supervised at break and lunch so you use them then. Pupils should not need to ask out to the toilet after break and lunch unless you absolutely have to.

The girls' toilet is also being monitored frequently by staff and are often visited by girls not really needing the toilet but who see it as a place to gather. The litter and general mess are unacceptable.

A toilet will always be available – First Aid, office or a member of SLT can help.

Please be aware that pupils who are found to be damaging school property will have their access restricted. This is far from ideal when it comes to needing to use the toilet, but they need to recognise the impact this has on others when toilets need to be closed for repairs or to be cleaned as a result of their behaviour.
